The necessities of life are soaring skyward, the big institutions are hollering their heads off because labor demands a higher wage, and the suckers endeavoring to graft the country press for free advertising space are still at large. O, Lord, what's to become of us?

While almost every other society has received favorable mention there has been little or nothing said about the great good work being done by the Salvation Army in the war-stricken countries. Their soldiers are in every country and the amount of suffering alleviated by these big hearted God and man loving men and women is immeasurable, especially in the war zones.

The church is a religious institution and makes for better. Every hamlet or district is better for having a church and a church organization. Don't let it enter your mind that it is a money-making affair, neither should your mind be so distorted as to think that the supporters are doing it for a show. They get nothing for their money except the satisfaction that they are trying to do some good, and are they succeeding can best be judged by comparing localities with churches along side of

localities where there is no religious organization. This is fair and will stand the acid test. If you live in a community where there is one or a dozen religious organizations it is your privilege to help support any one of them, it is also your duty to help support at least one of them. Don't you think so?

The bonding petition now being circulated calls for a hard surface road from the north end of the county connecting with some road leading into Clatsop county, running south through Tillamook, Cloverdale and the Little Nestucca to some road leading out of the county. It also calls for the vote to be taken at the primary election on the 19th of next month. The backers of the bonding measure are men who have given the matter careful consideration, are men who pay a large amount of taxes, and men who have been convinced that it is the only way in which Tillamook county can secure a hard surface road without waiting until doom's day. As to the particular kind of a hard surface road, we are willing to take the judgment of the county court and the men recommended to be appointed to assist the county court.

TALK PEACE; BREED WAR.

Col. Gardner, of Portland, at a meeting of old soldiers in that city, discusses very truthfully and frankly that which is uppermost in the minds of all the people. He says:

"It is futile to talk of peace on earth as long as nations are taught to hate each other. Even in school books, history is perverted and the wrongs which one nation does to another are made to appear as justifiable. Wrongs which one nation may do another are never entirely forgotten. Stolen territory, murder of its citizens, reiterated slander by a subsidized press beget deep hatred in the hearts of those who thereby suffer, and as the Roman senate was daily reminded by a senator,—"Carthage delenda est."—Carthage must be destroyed—so will the nation which feels itself deeply wronged, prepare itself for vengeance. Carthage was destroyed so was the Roman empire.

"Violations of treaties and of international law, founded on principles of the Decalog and of honorable conduct must be punished in nations, as disobedience of law by individuals is punished, before the community of nations

can ever hope to live with each other in peace and good will.

"For this country, the opportunity for which the ages have been hoping lies before it. Let us set the example to the world that we are not bound to follow bad precedents of the past. In our intercourse with other nations let us try to obey the Decalog and include the Golden Rule. Even if we should see for ourselves a temporary advantage by doing that which our best conscience tells us is wrong, let us be a gentleman in the family of nations. The course of honorable conduct and restrained action is sometimes not easy to follow, it often is the unpopular one. It is so much easier to follow the unthinking crowd and the evil precedents of the past. Let us by honorable diplomacy and fair dealing, cultivate the friendship of all nations, and especially of those to the south of us. May this glorious republic of ours set an example of national righteousness to the world of which we and our children will be proud, for it is still true that righteousness exalteth a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people."

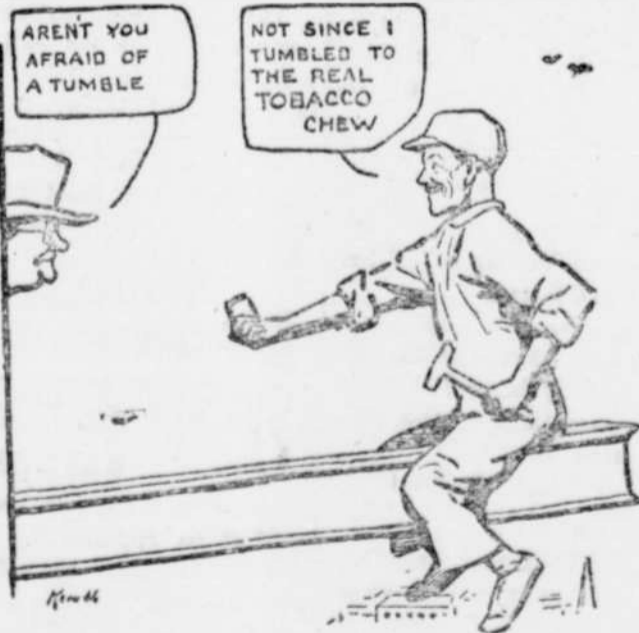
