OFFICIAL ELECTION RETURNS

Under the primary system, now operative, the most important part of the election is the nomination. The republicans being far in the lead in Tillamook county nomination of the republican ticket is considered, in many instances, equal to an election, however, this will not hold good in every case.

It is possible by the primary vote for Democrats and Progressives to have a full county ticket in the fall election.

The nomination of Tom Handley for joint senator is conceded by his opponents.

The fact that some voters wrote unnecessary names in on the ballots caused considerable delay in counting the ballots at the polls, and more so in making the official canvass. This piece of boy-play on the part of voters cost Tillamook county quite a respectable sum of money.

Reports from the outside counties are not all in yet and any attempt at estimating on state and congressional nominees would be only guess work.

For Circuit Judge George R. Bagley received a majority of 442 in Tillamook county and the majorities received in many Washington county precincts assures his nomination beyond doubt.

S. S. Johnson will be Bagley's opponent for election in November, Johnson having no opposition for nomination on the Democratic ticket. Regardless of his political affiliation Mr. Johnson will get all of the Democratic votes and some of the Republican votes. Local pride and the fact that Mr. Johnson is qualified and has a high standing accounts for this.

Reports of double crossing candidates was openly discussed on the streets in Tillamook and it is said had not the fact been discovered it would have made a material change.
