**BIG CELEBRATION
GRAND TIME**

**Program of Parade and Other
Notable Events.**

The grand parade will fall in ranks at 10 o'clock, sharp, under the direction of the Marshall of the Day, starting at Mr. Kraner's residence at the head of Main street, and march to the foot of the hill just beyond F. L. Owens' residence and return, breaking ranks at starting point and parking machines, wagons, etc., as directed by officer in charge, or his assistants.

Marx, will entertain with patriotic address. After the assemblage, America will be sung by the throng, accompanied by the band before the introduction of the speaker.
