Place Your Name on Your Parcels Post Packages.

The postoffice department at Washington has made a ruling to the effect that in the future all fourth class mail matter must carry on the outside, preferably the upper left hand corner, the name and address of the sender. The postal rules and regulations govern this class as follows: Parcels of fourth class matter cannot be accepted for mailing unless it bears the name and address of the sender.

This ruling has not been strictly enforced in the past, and as a result many complications have arisen both in the department and with the recipients of the parcels. As no writing is allowed in the packages, the person to whom it is addressed cannot tell from where it comes unless the outside bears the required name and address.
