## CASE IS SETTLED.

The Sour Grass Road Contractor and Counties Reach Agreement.

After several days in Court at Hillsboro the County Courts of Tillamook and Yamhill and the contractor, Mr. Hicks, reached a settlement last week Friday.

The counties of Tillamook and Yamhill will pay the contractor \$4000 for the extra amount of material moved by the contractor in excavating for the Sour Grass road. It was shown, and Tillamook has always been ready to admit, that there was more dirt moved than the figures of the engineer called for, and they were willing to pay for this, but could not exactly agree on the classification of the material moved. Yamhill county was inclined to stick to the figures of the engineer, but when it was shown that there were errors in the figures they conceded and a settlement was reached.

The contractor sued for \$8000.
