To the Clerk of School District No. 22, Tillamook County, Oregon:

Following is a statement of the estimated amount of money needed by the district during the fiscal year beginning on June 20, 1916, and ending on June 17, 1917. This budget is made in compliance with Section 208 of the School Laws of 1915, and includes the estimated amounts to be received from the county school fund, state school fund, special district tax and all other moneys of the district:
