### BOTH BOND ISSUES CARRY

### The County Bond Issue Soars Nearly Three to One.

The State Bond Measure Has a Majority of Over 20,000---Now for Hardsurface Roads.

Monday last witnessed the most interesting election ever held in Tillamook County. The agitation for hardsurface roads bad been started over three years ago and bonding the county to get the roads discussed many times. A real campaign of education was not put on foot, however, until about a year ago, when it was decided that the surest way to get the voters to bond for hardsurface roads was to open every channel of information that could be bad.

F. R. Beals headed this campaign of education, and through his untiring efforts and the expenditure of considerable time, every phase of the bonding question was given to the voters for discussion, and to him credit is due for a good part of the splendid result of the county election.


