The object is to keep in touch with those who have sons, husbands, brothers or other relatives in the service, and to be ready in case of emergency to render assistance or relief without delay.

It is intended to furnish duplicate lists to the different Red Cross branches throughout the county, and it is earnestly requested that members of the Red Cross and relatives and friends will assist by sending the names of the men in service to Thos. Coates, Tillamook, Oregon, who is chairman of the committee, or to C. J. Edwards or C. A. McGhee, of Tillamook, the other members of the committee.

A special request is made for the names of those who enlisted in the army or navy or marine service and are in commands other than the 10th company Coast Artillery, and also of those who may be serving in any ambulance, aviation, hospital, transport, engineers corps or other special service.
