**Superstructure is Under Way.**

The most important part of building operations is the sub structure or foundation. It is particular work. Unless the foundation be strong, the superstructure will be weak. It takes longer to build the foundation than it usually does the super structure.

The United States government has taken a whole year to lay the foundation for its war activities. It has been obliged to go to the hard clay or rock bottom, spread out in various directions with retaining and area walls, and has looked after the minutest details. This has required a long time, but now that it is finished, the government is in a position where it can continue building without hindrance, rain or shine.

The whole working force is pitching in and the upper works are going ahead at an amazing pace. There will be no

further delay. The machinery is all set up, the plans are all drawn and approved, the men are engaged, and from this time forward there will be nothing to stay the progress of the great plant which is necessary to keep our soldiers in France fully supplied and equipped to fight the foe of the world.

**Enrolling Station U. S. Shipping Board.**

In the window of the Rexall Drug Store, Tillamook, there is displayed a double-page advertisement from a current issue of a great national weekly that brings the war on the sea directly home to this section, and to the store where the advertising appears. The proprietor of the store has a personal interest in the advertisement also, for it relates to war work that he is doing for the government. Furthermore, he helped pay for it, and the cost of the "ad" for the single issue was \$10,000.

The advertisement asks for 50,000 men, between 21 and 30, for service in the new Merchant Marine. In the language of its headline, it offers "50,000 jobs at sea" to clean-cut young Americans. It states that the U. S. Shipping Board will give them special training before putting them into actual sea service, carrying supplies to our armies and Allies in the fighting fields of Europe. So much importance is attached to this work that men accepted for it are exempted from a call to military duty.

The advertisement relates further, that "the Rexall Stores throughout the United States, nearly 7,000 of them, have been designated by the Government as enrolling stations for the U. S. Shipping Board. At these stores, right in their own home towns, young men may now 'sign on' for training and subsequent sea duty in the U. S. Merchant Marine."
