tion to have him come to Oregon was kept quiet by the Bishop and his cabinet, and was not known to any others except Mr. Hopkins until the appointment was read out. There was objections made by leaders in the conference, and the church at Helena, Montana, had requested the appointment of Mr. Hopkins to that church through a special representative. There is strong pressure being brought to bear by the leading ministers in the Montana Conference, and by some prominent laymen, with Bishop Mouzon, to have him returned at the next conference. On the other hand, there is strong pressure being brought to bear to retain him in this conference, and Presiding Elder Orr informed Mr. Hopkins during his recent visit here, that he would use his utmost influence to retain him in the bounds of this conference. Mr. Hopkins is silent and undecided about the

question, and said there would be plenty of time to settle the question by the time conference met. There are many pulpits vacant in the church, and he usually receives calls every year from distant conference. Pressure has been brought to bear to secure his services in California, West Virginia, and Arkansas.
