## SCHOOL CHILDREN'S FAIR

The industrial fair for the students of the schools of Baker county, to be held in the manual training building of the high school in Baker on Tuesday and Wednesday, October 9 and 10, will be open both afternoon and evening. The fair will be divided into two parts, city and country, and there will be no competition between the two except in the one division of garden products. All children will be divided into two groups, A and B; the A group including all over 12 years of age and the B group those 12 years of age and under. All work must be entirely the pupil's own and he must certify to this. Exception is made only in the case of gardening in which the plowing of the ground may be done by the parents.

Cash premiums will be paid for many different garden products; canned fruits and vegetables; jellies, bread, cake, candy and cookies; sewing; mechanical and art work.

Exhibits will be received by Miss Elmetta Bailey, County School Superintendent, on or before Tuesday morning, Oct. 9th.
