Bulletin on Irrigating Grain.

The U. S. department of Agriculture has just issued a new Farmers' Bulletin No. 863 entitled 'Irrigation of Grain" which will be of interest to Eastern Oregon farmers. A copy may be obtained by dropping a line to Hon. N. J. Sinnott, Room 242 House of Representatives, Washington, D. C. Send for a copy.

Hereafter the rate of postage on letters will three cents per ounce or fraction thereof, instead of two cents as heretofore. Drop letters for city or rural delivery will be two cents per ounce. All post cards will also be two cents.
