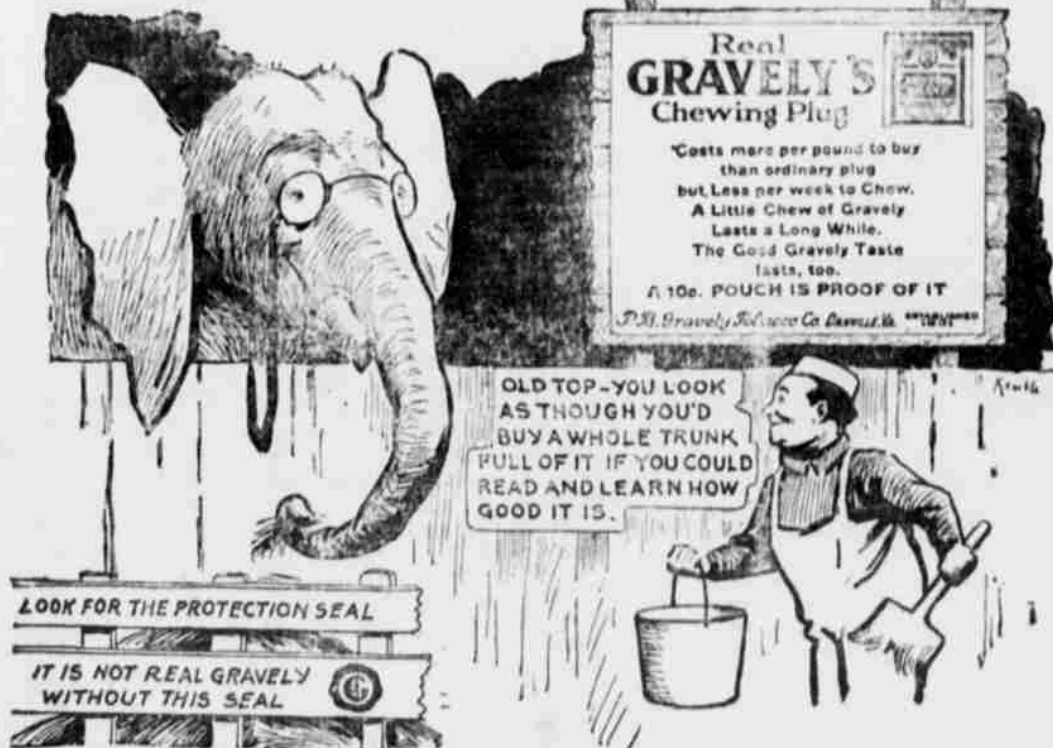

OBITUARY.

Richard Watson Makinson was born in Missouri on December 28, 1846, and died at Turlock, Calif., on November 27, 1917, aged 70 years, 10 months and 29 days. He was left an orphan when but two years of age and for the next eight years made his home with a brother-in-law, after which he started out in the world to make his own way. In 1872 he was married to Mariah Brooks in Linn county, Kansas, and four years later crossed the plains going first to Pine Valley but later in the same year removing to Eagle Valley, where he lived until 1912 when he moved to Turlock.

Mr. Makinson was the father of six children, five of whom are left with their mother (aged 71 years) to mourn his demise. The children surviving are Fred and Josiah of Turlock, Calif.; Robert of Fallon, Nevada; Charley, a resident of Utah, and Mrs. Alberta Kendall of Richland.

Because the meat reserves of the world are so diminished, the government urges an increased production of poultry because it offers the fastest and cheapest possible source of meat increase. The more poultry and eggs we eat the less beef and pork we will need or want—leaving that much more to be sent to Europe.

New Foodstuffs are Recommended for Use in Germany

Concentrated straw fodder and ground grape pips are suggested for table use in Germany. In a published list of new foodstuffs, with descriptions of use, the following are also found:

Rhubarb leaves, straw meal, seaweed, crushed and ground maize ears, ground sugar-beet seeds, heather stalks, parsley seed, wild radish husks, bran, wine yeast, beechnut cake, fish meal and various mixed foods.
