Eagle Valley News:
The following letter which may be of general news value to the stockmen, has been received from the District Forester:

"The large amount of accumulated work on the various forests has delayed the annual grazing reports and it is not expected that authorization for the various forests, showing the number of stock to be grazed on each, with seasons and fees, will be prepared and forwarded in sufficient time to allow the stockmen to file applications and in this connection stockmen should be informed through the press and by sending applications to them, that all applications should be on file in the various supervisors' offices immediately."

In this connection I might state that all applications from regular grazing permittees should be on file in the Supervisor's office on or before January 20th.
