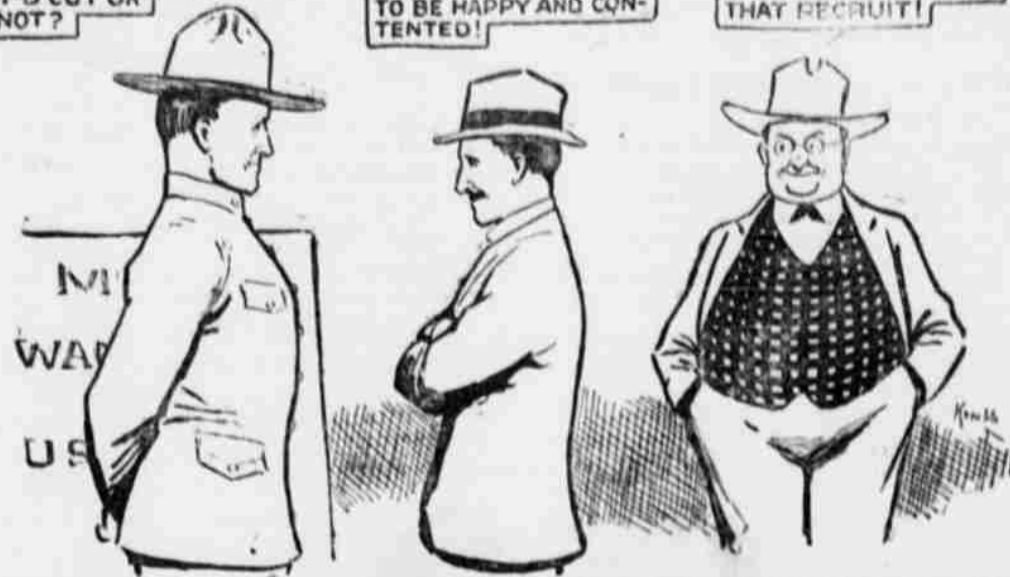

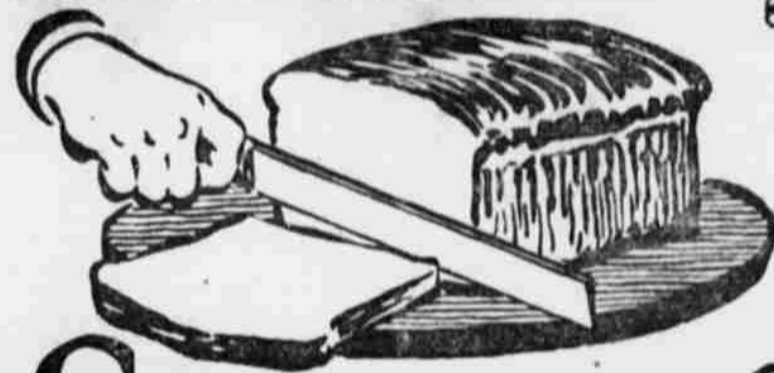

The U. S. Civil Service Commission has announced an examination for the County of Baker, Oregon, to be held at Robinette, at 1:30 p. m., on March 8, 1918, to fill the position of rural carrier at Halfway, Ore., and vacancies that may later occur on rural routes from other post offices in the Baker county.
