Great Wheat Stocks Isolated.

It's the shortage in ships that is putting the Allies and the United States on wheat rations. Great stocks of wheat are isointed in India, and Australia. At great sacrifice in ship space and use the Allies are forced to secure some wheat from Argentina.

On January 1, Australia had stored 100,000,000 bushels of wheat that was ready for export-but there were no ships. Then came the new crop with an exportable surgius of 80,000,-000 bushels. Now Australia has approximately 180,000,000 hushels walting for ships.

India, at the sume time, had 70,000,000 hushels of wheat stored for export. During April 50,000.000 hushels more out of the new crop will be added to the rdie.

Argentian closed the last ship-= mean with 11,000,000 ping bushels of wheat left in the stock available for export. The new crop will add 135,000,000 to the left over.


