FIGHT OVER WATER

As a result of a long standing quarrel over the use of water, Percy Pearce and John Chipman got into a terrible fight on the Maley Ranch in Pine Valley last Friday afternoon.

We are informed that Chipman made an attempt to strike Pearce with a shovel but the latter ward off the blow and clinched with his antagonist who drew a dagger and made repeated attempts to stab him. Luckily, Pearce held Chipman in such a manner that the dagger could not be used to any great advantage, but received eight severe flesh wounds on his side before onlookers stepped in and disarmed Chipman. Both men were beaten up considerably before they were separated.

As Chipman made threats that he would kill Pearce, Sheriff Anderson was notified and in company with County Attorney Levins went to Pine Valley Saturday and took the man to the county seat, and being unable to secure bail was locked up until the case could be investigated by the grand jury.

Eylar Staight Decorated.

Eylar Staight has the honor of being the first boy from this section to "go over the top" of the first line trenches in France, and has received a medal from the French government for valor. Eylar is in the Marine Corps, has been at the front for some time, and as far as we are able to ascertain is the first man from Eastern Oregon to win decoration in France.

WHEATLESS RECIPES

Barley and Oat Bread

1 cup liquid 1 teaspoon salt
4 tablesp'ns fat 2 cup barley flour
4 " syrup 2 eggs
1 cups ground rolled oats
6 teaspoons baking powder
(Some cooks find they can use the same recipe satisfactorily with only 2 tablespoons fat and but 1 egg.)

Mix melted fat, liquid, syrup and eggs. Combine liquid and and well mixed dry ingredients. Bake as a loaf in a moderately hot oven for one hour, or until thoroughly baked.

Nuts, raisins or dates may be added if desired.

Corn Flour and Oat Bread

Same as above recipe, except use 1 1-3 cups corn flour instead of the 2 cups barley flour and use only 3-4 cup of liquid.

Cornmeal Wafers

1-2 cup sugar 1-2 cup fat
1 egg well beaten 1-2 cup milk
1 cup corn meal
1 cup barley flour
1 teaspoon soda dissolved in
2 tablespoons hot water

Mix as for cookies; roll out and cut with a large knife. Bake in a quick oven.

If you must use wheat flour at all try the following.

Potato Rolls

3 cups mashed potatoes
4 1-2 cups flour
3 teaspoons salt
2 tablespoons corn syrup
1 cake compressed yeast softened
in 1-4 cup water
3-4 cup milk scalded
2 tablespoons fat

Add hot milk to the potato and when mixture has cooled until it is lukewarm, add softened yeast and other ingredients. Allow the dough to rise to double its bulk. Work it down and let it rise until it has increased its size by about one-half; then shape three dozen rolls, let them rise until they are double in size and bake in a hot oven.
