The white hart is a very old emblem. Diomedes consecrated to Diana white hart which, after a thousand years, was killed by Agathocles, king of Sicily. Pliny records that Alexander caught a white stag and placed a coling of gold about its neck; then this was done by Julius Caesar, and was handed down from hero to hero, with the usual changes in story to prevent anachronism. There was once a white hart caught in Windsor forext, one elsewhere in England, one in France and one in Germany, the last of which was killed by Charlemagne, Then after three centuries, Richard Coour de Lion siew it, the whole story. being inscribed in stone on the walls of the cathedral of Lubec.
