The text of the Indian war veterans' pension bill, recently enacted, is exceedingly simple but thoroughly comprehensive. Its benefits are to be extended impartially to all survivors who served thirty days or more in the Indian wars, from the Seminole war in 1817-18 to the Indian wars in Oregon and Washington territories from 1851 to 1856 inclusive. As in other pension laws, the surviving widows of such soldiers, provided they have not remarried, are included in the list of those eligible for pensions under this act. The monthly pension rate will not be large, and there is no "back pay" provided, the beginning of the payment to be dated from the passage of the act. But the amount will, in the case of needy pensioners, of whom the public has often been told there are relatively a large number in Oregon, give promise of many comforts of living that without it could not be obtained. To those who are not needy, the allowance will take the form of recognition of services that will be grateful to the recipients.—Oregonian.

It is reported that the board appointed by the government to visit the obstructions above The Dalles will be unable to come before fall to make their examination. This virtually suspends work for another year. Something radically wrong always turns up at the right time to delay important things that the people are interested in.

Clatsop county is \$71,975 in debt, according to the statement of the treasurer of that county; while Clackamas county shows an indebtedness of \$92,421. It will take these counties a long while to be financially where our little Sherman county is.

A. A. Ames, mayor of Minneapolis, has been indicted and arraigned in court, charged with receiving money for protection from keepers of disorderly houses. The mayor denies the charge and demands a speedy trial.

Goldendale Defeats Moro.
Quite a number of people assembled on the ball grounds on Friday last to witness the game between Moro and Goldendale. The weather was all that could be desired, and with the gay suits of the ball tossers and the bright display of colors on the grandstand, the grounds had quite a gala appearance.

Umpire Myers called the game at half-past two with Goldendale at the bat. The firstinning passed off without a score, as did the second and third. In the fourth the visitors made two tallies, adding another in the seventh and 3 in the ninth, making their score 6 in all. Moro did not score until the fifth inning, when she made 2, which, with 1 in the seventh and 2 in the eighth, brought her score up to 5, leaving Goldendale a victor by 1 tally.

The Moro boys have had hard luck lately, being in three games so close that only one run in each event stood between them and victory. Owing to the accident to Pitcher Dunlar's forearm on Thursday, Jerry Madden of the Wasco team pitched on Friday for Goldendale. He pitched an excellent game owing, as some people say, to "the shrewd coaching of Umpire Myers," whose rulings, it might be said here, gave very general dissatisfaction to the home team and a number of the spectators. Meach of Moro pitched a fine game, striking out 14 men.

Murphy, who caught for the home team, is also worthy of mention. The pitcher and catcher can't win a game alone, however; and a few unlucky errors just at the critical moment, together with

a very rank decision by the umpire, cost Moro the game.
