PROPOSED ROAD FROM MORO TO CONDON--DISTANCE, 37 MILES.

The subjoined map will enable our readers to form an idea as to the route of the proposed road from Moro to Condon.



The proposed road is estimated to be about 37 miles long, and will be on the following route: Commencing at Moro; thence southeasterly to connect with the Lone Rock road; thence along said road to Willow Creek canyon...

It should be borne in mind that not more than seven miles of said proposed road will need to be constructed, as there is already a good public highway from Moro to Willow Creek canyon...

The heavy dotted line on the above map between Ajax and Condon, represents that a good county road connects these two points, and the distance between Ajax and the river is about 3 miles.

Many competent judges of the situation say that the proposed road will be of great public benefit, and will furnish the people of Gilliam county a good highway for travel between Condon and the chief trading points in Sherman county.
