EASTERN OREGON STOCK RANGE.

The Oregonian, in one of its editorials, advocates that the government ranges in Eastern Oregon be classified, arranged in districts, and leased to those able to give them proper care. This would be a very excellent course to pursue if it were possible to prevent the whole government range in each district from getting into the hands of large corporations to the detriment of the host of small sheep-owners who depend solely on the wool industry for a livelihood.

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IMPORTANT TO SHEEPMEN.

We publish the following letter from Capt. Ormsby for the benefit of whom it may concern: First—Sheep-owners are cautioned not to be in haste to start their sheep for the Reservation.

Second—The eating out of the ranges of settlers by sheep on their way to the mountains is becoming a serious matter, and is being brought to the attention of the Department in a manner that cannot be ignored.

Third—The attention of sheep-owners is called especially to one of the exceptions areas, which is as follows: The East 1/4 of Tps. 12, 13, 14, 15, 16 and 17 S., R. 9 E.

Fourth—Sheep-owners are cautioned as to the character of the men they have in their service the coming season. The owner is himself seldom on the range.

Fifth—A large number of applications are yet due from owners. These must be forwarded without further delay.
