So many fools have jumped down Bryan's throat in the last three years, it is little wonder it should give out at the critical moment.

The man who can find fault with the speeches made by President McKinley on his trip West, is open to the charge of lack of patriotism. He has uttered no word of partisan politics.

There are some Democratic newspapers, and they are the best ones by the way, that are making a tremendous effort to save Mr. Bryan from his views on the Philippine question.

Peter the Great, Emperor of Russia, was great in stature as well as mind. He stood 6 ft. 8 in. Lincoln was 6 ft. 1 in., and Napoleon 5 ft. 4 in., while Nelson was smaller still, 5 ft. 4 in.

The highest tribute yet paid to Signor Marconi, who has demonstrated the success of his wireless telegraphy system by reporting the yacht races with it, came from Thomas Edison, who said, "He succeeded where I failed."

At the laying of the cornerstone of the Parnell monument at Dublin, enthusiastic Irishmen wildly cheered "Gallant Old Kruger." These same people cheered "Gallant Old Parnell" in the same way, but afterwards joined in hounding him into his grave.

In the Oregon Supreme Court, on Oct. 16th, the judgment of the lower court was affirmed in the case of the State vs. M. E. McElvain, convicted in Sherman county for forgery. The opinion was written by Chief Justice Wolverton.

An administration which would follow the advice of the American League, a New York anti-organization, to withdraw our troops from the Philippines, and apologize to Aguinaldo for having sent them there, would receive and deserve the condemnation of nine-tenths of the people of the United States.

T. L. Caviness, who has a large contract with the Oregon Sugar Company to grow beets on 125 acres of land near Island City, says the pulp is the best ration that can be found for stock. He will feed 1000 sheep on it this fall, and if he could secure the sheep he would probably feed 2500 more.

Ex-Governor Pattison is another distinguished Democrat who declines to join in bucking the cow-catcher of national expansion.

Naturally the country is somewhat alarmed over the long time that Governor Pingree of Michigan has been holding his breath.

His Democratic friends will presumably be sorry to hear that Aguinaldo's plan for a rising among the lower classes in Manila was detected and suppressed last week.

In spite of the denial by Secretary of State Hay, the Ohio Democrats are still insisting that we have a secret alliance with England. While this bugaboo may be necessary for their scheme of deluding the German voters, it is likely to prove a boomerang.

Amongst all the curiosities brought home by the returned troops from the Philippines, we do not hear of a bamboo opal, a vegetable gem with all the characteristic lines of the opal, reproduced so faithfully that experts have been puzzled to know the difference between the real opal and the vegetable specimen.

Army officers seem to have taken kindly to life at Porto Rico, and seem to think the Island cannot do very well without them. They are a unit in opposing the withdrawal of military authority for some time to come, and say that the natives, even the most intelligent of them, need to be educated in how to govern themselves before being allowed to do so.

The story having been widely circulated that the administration was using the Cuban civil service to make places for Americans, an official report has been obtained from Collector Bliss of Havana, which shows that of the 595 persons in the customs service in Cuba, 545 are natives, and that at 5 of the 16 ports there are no Americans employed, except the army officer acting as collector.

Congressman Roberts, the Mormon from Utah, is finding out that his case has not been lost sight of, by the demands which are being made for his expulsion from the house, as soon as he takes his seat. The insinuation that many congressmen who live as polygamists without being openly Mormons, will not dare to vote for the expulsion of the much-married congressman, ought to cause every decent member of the house to vote for his expulsion.

The Antis may well take a lesson from the closing up in the ranks of all parties in England on the first intimation of the country's being forced to go to war. Liberals and conservatives have laid aside their party bickerings, and all have joined in aiding the administration in quelling a dangerous insurrection. A house divided against itself cannot stand, and internal dissensions and party jealousy are not what should be found in a country at the time of need.

The majority of the people of the United States are not in favor of the withdrawal of the troops from the Philippines until American supremacy is first established, and the party that seriously contemplates such a measure cannot begin to depend on the support of the people. Such measures are of no use in furthering the advance of the Democratic party; quite the contrary. Why not, therefore, join hands against the common enemy and bring this lingering war to a close. Comparisons cannot fail to be made between English tactics in South Africa and the progress made in our campaign in the Philippines, and if General Otis cannot bring the Filipinos to time before General Buller is through with the Boers, the United States will lose by the comparison.

Boys should early be taught the heinousness of the offense of spitting, both from the basis of decency and danger to public health, says the Oregonian. It is much easier to prevent the formation of a habit of this kind in a boy than to correct it in a man, and herein lies the mother's part in the warfare against spitting. No extension of woman's rights is necessary to make mothers a power in this neglected realm. All that is required is a return to a duty once faithfully discharged—but in the rush of modern life greatly neglected—the vigilant maternal supervision of boys during the years in which their habits are formed. The boy who is taught that to spit on the hearth, the steps—anywhere about the house—is an infringement upon the rights of the family that will not be tolerated, is not likely, as a man, to infringe upon the rights of the public by spitting upon the sidewalks, on the floors or steps of public buildings, or in the cars.

It is perhaps too much to hope that the newspapers, which have been abusing the President because of the Carter case, will now be ashamed of themselves, since the sentence of the court martial has been approved in all particulars. We hardly think that the most rancorous of Carter's pursuers can find fault with the conclusion of the case.

Contrary to expectations the Boers have not been able to hold their own with the British forces in South Africa. The initial battle of the war has been fought near Gliceo, Natal, and ended in the defeat of the burghers. Colonel Baden Powell, with a small force, has repulsed them at Mafeking, and while the situation there and at Kimberly is critical, there is no cause to suppose the Boers cannot be held in check at these points until General Buller arrives on the scene. Owing to these conditions it seems likely the war will be brought to a close much sooner than anticipated. The Boers have certainly not made the showing that was expected, and instead of driving the British into the sea, they have taken a lesson from the Filipinos, and are making tracks for the mountains, there to defend the passes at Laings Nek and other points on the Natal frontier. It is doubtful whether the British will attack these passes, as it is quite possible for General Buller to march right through the Orange Free State, leaving the Nek to be dealt with after Pretoria and Johannesburg are taken. This first defeat is a sad blow to the Boer cause, as many who would have joined them will now think it more prudent to keep out of the scrap.

The races for the international cup are over, and the defender Columbia has fairly and squarely beaten the Shamrock. Sir Thomas Lipton evidently made a serious mistake when he put three additional tons of ballast aboard his boat, and worse again placing it so far aft. The trouble in the race before the extra ballast was taken on, seemed to be that the Shamrock failed to point as high as the Columbia, and the placing of more ballast aft only increased that failing. Every yachtsman ought to know that the more a boat is trimmed by the stern the less she will gripe when close hauled, and vice versa, and the increased displacement would certainly be a detriment in running. As well as we are able to judge, the boat had no need of an increase of ballast. The reports of the races go to show that she stood up to her canvas better than her rival, and, in our humble opinion, three tons of ballast thrown overboard would have helped the Shamrock to make a closer race, if nothing else. When the accident occurred, which lost her the second race, it was a spar that was carried away, and there was nothing to show that she could not carry her spread of sail with ease. Sir Thomas takes his defeat like a gentleman and sportsman, and pays an eloquent tribute to American generosity and fairness. He will challenge again with another boat, if he can arrange matters so as to make it possible.
