OUR SCHOOL. A few words as to the number of scholars, and the grades taught by the different teachers in our school, may be of interest on the opening of the fourth room, which takes place this week. An enjoyable visit to the different rooms on Monday leaves us with the impression that our school is a credit to the town, the teachers, directors and the whole community. The fourth room, recently added, had our careful attention, and is fitted with 30 new single desks, blackboard, and all the appliances that are to be seen in an up-to-date school room. The classes are arranged as follows: In the room on the ground floor to the left, Miss Darby rules supreme, having the first and second grades in her charge, forty-five little tots. Turning to the room on the right we find Mrs. DeMoss, with her complement of 40 scholars, which make up the third, fourth and fifth grades. Up stairs, in the room on the right, Miss Holder will have in her charge 30 students of the 6th and 7th grades; and on the left we have Prof. Peery's room, with the eighth and ninth grades, 15 young ladies and gentlemen that are far advanced in their studies, and will soon take their places as useful men and women in the different walks of life. Here we have 130 scholars, with four efficient teachers, which we consider as good a showing as can be made by any town of equal size in Oregon.
