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A NEW PLOW.

Quite a number of our citizens and neighboring farmers congregated in a field near town on Saturday to hear Mr. N. B. Kizer, of Mitchell, Lewis & Staver of Portland, explain the merits of the J. I. The new plow has many improvements that recommend themselves to farmers, being exceptionally light draught, easy to turn at the ends, and so arranged that the operator can, by the use of one lever, raise his shares so as to clear any obstacle to be found in an ordinary field. The mechanism is so arranged that the wings do not drag on the ground when the shares are lifted, and wear out as in ordinary plows. Mr. Kizer gave a lucid explanation of the proper length of doubletrees, and on making a finish of his remarks, gave a practical definition of the light draught of the Triumph by hitching up two men to the plow, who actually dragged it quite a distance, turning two furrows.
