committee for the establishment of universal peace lead the peace group and at each meeting spoke on some different phase of the peace question. He explained the attitude of the League of Nations on the Manchurian situation and later discussed the arguments for the limitation of armaments. Cap. R. O. Scott spoke from the point of view of the army.

The discussion of the prohibition question probably elicited as much interest as did any of the other topics brought before the institute attendants. W. R. Richards of Hood River lead the temperance discussions although nearly everyone expressed an opinion at some time. The debate mainly centered on the question as to whether it was wise for the drys to insist on keeping the 18th amendment in force. Reliance strictly on moral force instead of on an unpopular law was held more successful by some although this position was not accepted by ardent drys. Dr. C. L. Poley spoke on "Medicine and Alcohol."

LIVESTOCK LAW

The law provides that every owner or shipper of horses, mules or cattle desiring to move stock from any county east of the Cascade mountains to another county or outside the state must furnish the county brand inspector with a list of the brands on them and a description of the animals. "In no instance shall horses, mules, asses or cattle be moved outside the county of origin before such inspection is made," said the law and it provides penalties of from \$50 to \$250 for violations thereof.
Common carriers that transport stock outside the county without first having the brands recorded with the stock inspector are subject to a fine of from \$250 to \$2500 and shall be responsible to the person injured for three times the amount of damage.
Stock inspector Stewart is brand inspector and he announces that he will appoint deputies who may be found at convenient points for the aid of shippers.
