**FAIR ADMISSION**

"Everybody Pays," says Max Gehlhar, state fair director, since there will be no passes printed this year.

Patrons, exhibitors, employees and concessionaires will be required to pay alike," Gehlhar said. "In reducing the price of admission and adopting the no pass policy we are following a system in use this year in other states.

"The change will in no way affect

our six day program. There will be no curtailment of activities. The Board of Agriculture adopted the 25-cent admission as a means of making it possible for more citizens to visit the State Fair and benefit from its many educational exhibits."

A season ticket is offered for one dollar this year. Children under ten will be admitted free. Among the reductions is that of the auto admission, from 50 to 25 cents. A season auto ticket sells for 75 cents. Exhibitors will be admitted free to the fair grounds on the Sunday before and after the fair. To the general public who desire to see a State Fair set up or dismantled the regular 25-cent charge will be made on Sunday.
