stated that signers should be prepared to take out of production the contracted acreage as specified in the contract. While it may be possible for a farmer to grow something valuable to him on the land in 1934 the secretary of agriculture may not permit it in 1933. The aim of the entire plan is to reduce the acreage and production of wheat and if this is defeated by growing of other crops that increase foods that may be

used for wheat the secretary may bar the growth of any crop on the contracted acreage. With the rules as they are now it is probable that farmers will receive several dollars per acre more for land out of production than that, that is put in crop.
