Mrs. E. B. Penland died at the family home at Halsey November 16 after being ill for several weeks. Mr. Penland is very ill and is not expected to live many weeks.

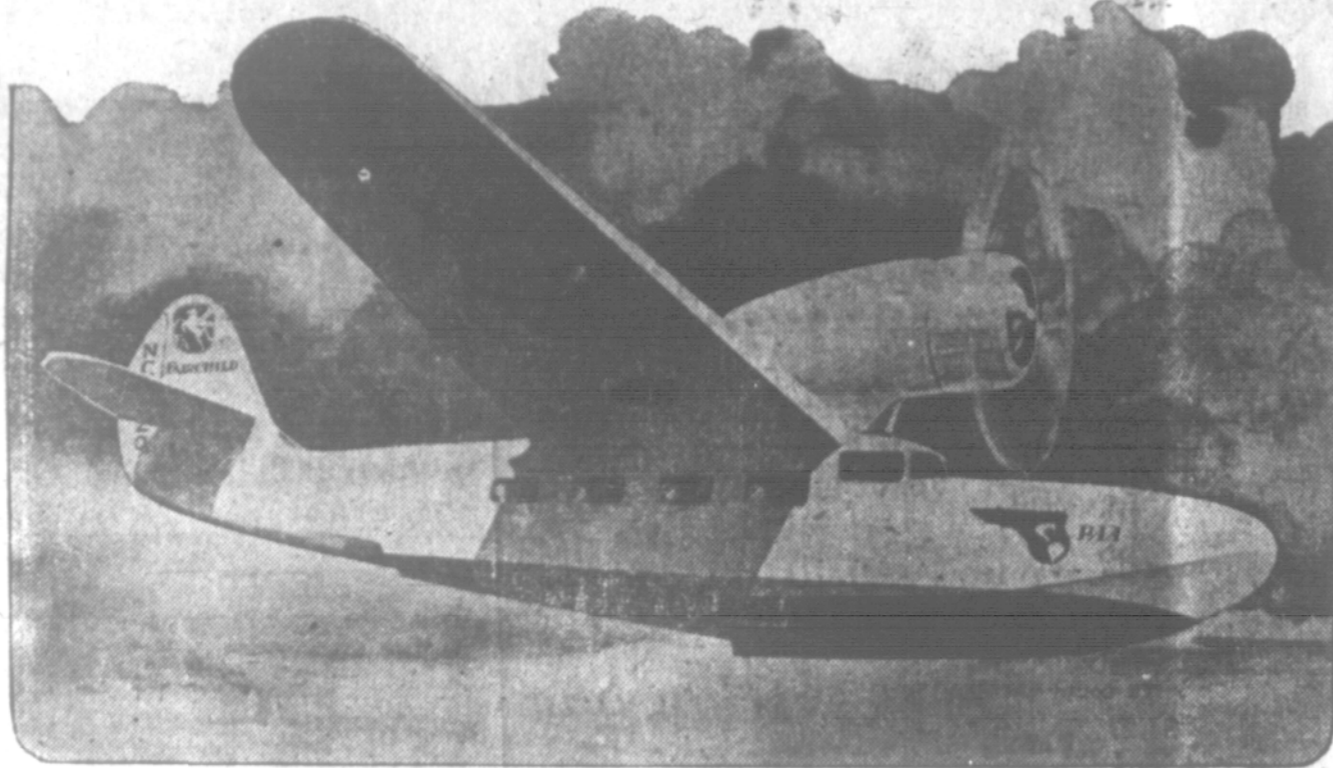
Joseph Patterson, 80, a farmer near The Dalles died there last week. At one time he lived on a homestead in Sherman county.

This new type of amphibian airliner has been accepted by the Pan American Airways and six have been ordered from the Fairchild company. The plane, carrying eight passengers and two pilots, will be the fastest of its type in the world, being capable of a speed of 180 miles per hour. It will be able to land in an emergency without wheels or pontoons.

Honey has innumerable uses as a substitute for sugar, candy, jams and jellies, molasses and other sirups. Being a liquid, honey blends more readily than a dry sweet with many combinations.

In preparing a mixed fruit salad, for example, drizzle the honey over it and top with plain whipped cream. For ice cream sundaes, add the fruit or nuts to honey and pour over the ice cream. For a delicious sandwich that holds together, spread the bread with honey over the butter, and sprinkle with chopped nuts or add cottage cheese.

Honey can be substituted with advantage for half of the sugar in recipes for breads, gingerbread, muffins, cookies, cakes, baked ham and apples, pies, salad dressings, puddings, candies and canning. When substituting honey for sugar in a recipe, omit one fourth cup of the liquid called for in the recipe for each cup of honey.

In measuring honey for baking purposes, measure the fat first in the cup or spoon and then measure the honey before washing the equipment. Honey that has been heated slightly is easier to handle than cold honey. Baked goods keep cool longer when made with honey instead of sugar, as the honey tends to attract moisture to it.

Continued from page one. much as those given in the official lists which raises a doubt about the authenticity of the government figures. For instance, in 1931 the warehouse men of the county testified that 1,230,684 bushels were put in elevators and warehouses in the county. The official figures are 1,264,000 bushels for the entire county. This does not allow much for seed, feed, and other means of disposal of the wheat crop of that year.

Matters of this nature will be argued before the board in an endeavor to have the county allotment raised. Otherwise the figures on the applications will have to be revised downward again and the local board feels that this would be unfair to the farmers.

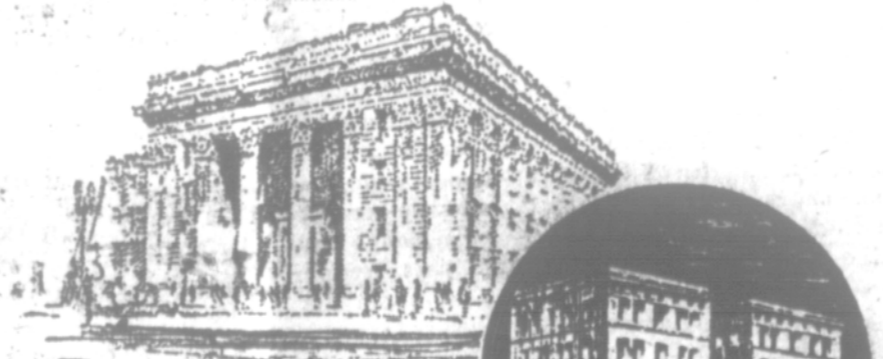
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
