**MORO SCHOOL NOTES**

**To Limit Infantile Paralysis**

Poliomyelitis (infantile paralysis) is again making its appearance in the state and it may be expected more frequently during the next two or three months. Community isolation has proven ineffective and the state board of health does not advise drastic measures. Major reliance should be placed on education of the public as to necessary precautions, early diagnosis and treatment of all cases before paralysis appears.

There is a natural inclination on the part of communities relatively free from infection to try to surround themselves with barriers designed to exclude possible carriers of infection. Experience in many epidemics has indicated clearly that extreme and extensive efforts to erect barriers against travel from the outside in general only gave a false sense of security, disrupted business, interfered with necessary community intercourse and led to confusion and hardships without ultimately accomplishing the purpose for which they were intended. With normal adults as likely to be carriers of infection as children and with our present day facilities for travel, it is practically impossible even for the most isolated community to erect any barrier which will not ultimately break down.

Even under epidemic conditions: the vast majority of children escape an attack and secondary cases in the same family are rare. Eighty per cent of those attacked ordinarily will recover. The aim should be to avoid paralysis by early diagnosis and administration of serum and by providing complete rest in bed with a little disturbance as possible.

Reasonable general rules, however, should be applied with judgment and discretion. The virus of the disease is present in the nose and mouth discharges of infected persons, whether cases or healthy carriers, and may be transferred through kissing, coughing, sneezing, through soiled hands, handkerchiefs, dishes, and eating utensils, by infection of milk supplies and possibly in other ways.

During an epidemic parents will do well to keep the children out of a crowd and away from homes where any kind of illness is present. Observation of general health rules is also important. Fresh air, hand washing before meals, plenty of sleep and proper daily elimination, are excellent rules for young and old alike.

The actual cause of poliomyelitis is not known and there is no accurate knowledge in regard to the manner in which it spreads. When a case is found every possible care should be taken to prevent the spread of the disease to others. Sick persons should be separated from other members of the family. All discharges from the nose, throat and intestines should be disinfected before disposing of them. The room should be screened and all animal pets excluded and all dishes, knives, forks, spoons, and all towels and bed linen used by the sick person should be boiled before being used by other persons.

A physician should be called on the appearance of illness. This is especially true if the child has following symptoms: Slight cold, headache, fever, vomiting, slight diarrhoea, and restlessness, accompanied by a desire not to be handled or an attitude of apprehension. Do not wait until paralysis develops.
