SENATOR McNARY

As far as this county is concerned there seems to be general acceptance of the candidacy of Chas. McNary for United States senator as satisfactory to both Republicans and Democrats alike.

The reason for this almost unanimous support is the record of Oregon's senior senator. He has been the major factor in bringing to Oregon the famed Bonneville dam;

Much of the improvement work that has been done on the Columbia river has been procured by Senator McNary. This includes the deepened channel from Bonneville to Vancouver and the dredging of the upper river to the Umatilla rapids.

As chairman of the agricultural committee of the senate, he has had an important influence in such legislation, especially as it concerns Oregon.

It goes without saying, of course, that a man for so important a position as United States senator should be elected, not for his stand on some one measure, but for his record and attitude on general legislation which affects and is likely to affect the state and nation.

SOME CANDIDATES

A peculiar situation has arisen in the Republican ticket this year. Seventeen candidates are seeking to go to Cleveland as delegates to the convention from the state at large.

Seventeen are running for four jobs and in this district three are running for two jobs. Peculiar, and unfortunate, for there are many good men among the seventeen who cannot be elected.

Among the group are three from eastern Oregon, Ben Litfin, who is publisher of a newspaper in The Dalles and is known to many Sherman countians who will undoubtedly give him a good vote.

There are other well known names in the list. There is Earl Goodwin, Governor Martin's one time secretary; Arthur Geary, freight rate attorney, Joe Dunne, gubernatorial candidate, Tom Verdenius, Dr. Smith, Irving Rand and Stanley Myers, all of Multnomah county.

We feel safe in recommending Ben Litfin and Arthur Priaulx as men who are acquainted with the second district and able to look out for its interests.

The race for national committeeman of the Republican party is being run between Ralph Williams, 28 year old veteran in the job, and Ben Dorris, young filbert grower of Eugene. In the opinion of the court it was held that "rules and regulations which have been prescribed by the State Relief committee were within the power of that committee to make and prescribe; that such rules and regulations are reasonable and that the disbursements of federal, state and county funds through a single agency such as the State Relief committee was contemplated by chapters 407 and 55 if such should be the method provided by the State Relief committee rather than through the counties separately."

"It cannot be questioned that the disbursement of old age pension funds can be managed much more effectively, uniformly and with less expense through one central agency rather than through thirty-six independent agencies whether the latter attempt to make disbursements independently or in conjunction with the central state agency," Justice Bailey declared.

The verbal tilt between Governor Martin and Attorney General Van Winkle this week over the Clatsop county labor riot paroles is generally regarded here as presaging another attempt on the part of administration forces to make the attorney generalship an appointive office at the next legislative session.

The issue which came near disrupting the state capitol commission at its meeting in Portland last week is understood to have been: Shall the new state house have two domes typifying the elongated ears of the Democratic donkey or a single dome glorifying the trunk of the familiar Republican pachyderm?

The population at the state prison is rapidly approaching the all-time peak of 967 reached in 1929. Number of convicts in the penitentiary passed the 940 mark this week, within 17 of the record.

Annual reports now being filed by public service corporations are being carefully analyzed by Frank McColloch, public utilities commissioner, in an effort to determine possible grounds for rate reductions. McColloch has announced that he prefers to bring about rate concessions through negotiations with utility officials rather than through statutory hearings which he regards as too costly to be justified except as a last resort.

Direct relief for Oregon's unemployed will be confined to profits of the state liquor set-up, according to Governor Martin. Disbursements for this purpose during May, it is estimated, will range between \$140,000 and \$150,000. Liquor profits for this year are expected to reach \$2,000,000.

The state printing plant turned out \$43,261 worth of work during the first quarter of this year, it was reported by E. C. Hobbs, state printer. The plant's best customer was the state department which used \$13,320 worth of printing during the three months. Salaries

paid to employees of the printing department for the three months aggregated \$15,283.75. Paper purchases totalled \$21,513.70.
