conditions gives special consideration to the probable trend of prices for eggs, dairy products, beef, hogs, lambs, wool and wheat.

According to the analysis, prospective supply and demand conditions are quite favorable in respect to dairy products and hogs, especially. The number of milk cows in relation to the population of the United States is showing a moderate downward trend, while consumers demand has been strengthening. These two factors account for most of the changes in the trend of Oregon butterfat prices from year to year, according to data in the published report.

Although the mainstay of the box, the luncheon sandwiches need never become humdrum. A great variety of fillings and unusual breads make planning easy. Use slices of white, rye, whole wheat, raisin, nut, Boston Brown, orange or date bread and spread both slices generously with softened butter. Then decide upon any one of numerous sandwich fillings listed below, but don't tell your child in advance what he will find in his lunch box. Let the child anticipate the surprises he will find and carrying a lunch to school will always remain great fun.

So many things can be done to make the box lunch interesting and attractive. The foods should be wrapped well so they will be separated and not become unwrapped as they are carried to school. Heavy waxed paper cups with covers carry desserts in good order. Straws make the bottle of milk far more interesting, particularly the brightly colored cellophane straw now available. Small squares of yellow cheese are easy to cut and a nourishing accompaniment to the vacuum bottle of hot creamed soup which during the cold months may replace the bottle of milk in the lunch box. Fix the cheese sonnet with toothpick handles if your child enjoys dipping his cheese into the soup for a combination of flavors that children as well as grown ups are enthusiastic about.

And when it is all ready, pack the food in the order in which it will or should be eaten, and on the very top place two or three attractive paper napkins.

Whether your child eats his lunch from a paper sack at school desk or from the most modern of lunchrooms, daintiness in the preparation and packing of the food is of primary importance. Children are sensitive and they want to be proud of their lunches as they unpack it before their friends.

So many things can be
