Mrs. Ed Feldman was in Portland on business last week.

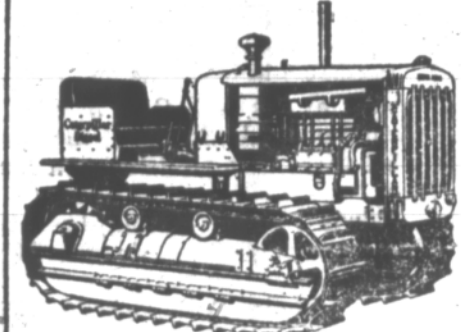
Work on the new culvert across the ditch is about completed making a needed and permanent improvement to the appearance and safety of the city. The county crew was in charge of the work.
