## Hallowe'en Parties

October 31st, Hallowe'en and parties now go together like Winkin, Blinkin and Nod. But if you should be asked if this has always been true, you would not "Nod."

The origin of Hallowe'en... "all Saints' night out," are varied. The Celts celebrated the end of October as the day of "summers end"; a day when evil spirits were abroad. The Teutonic May Eve Assemblage of witches brought its hags and their attendant beasts to help celebrate this night.

In Colonial days Hallowe'en was little celebrated in America. However, today it revels in fostering the spirit of ancient merry-making - elves, goblins and fairies are native. Mysterious and mischievous spirits choose the time for carrying off and misplacing numerous objects, ringing doorbells, rapping on windows and generally, frightening the populace with grotesque spectres.

Today America, in its celebration of Hallowe'en, becomes mindful of providing festivities for the children. Service clubs in communities sponsor costume parades and contests that will absorb the hours of early evening play, and these are frequently followed by home parties for the pleasure of young and old. The decorations make plain the two original elements of the festival, namely, the harvest, in the protuse use of apples and nuts for games and refreshments; and the spirits, in

black cats, ghosts and witches for atmosphere.

When the table centerpiece reflects a hollowed pumpkin well filled with apples, grapes and nuts, or a pumpkin chariot drawn by toy figures of mice (from the 6 and 10 store or home made from dried fruits) it gives the appearance of one of Pomona's feasts.

The Hallowe'en cake - palatable in its butter base, has baked in for fortunes sake, a ring, key, thimble, penny and button to foretell respectively, speedy marriage, journey, spinsterhood, wealth and bachelorhood.

Additional refreshments may include round dark bread sandwiches spread with creamy cheese or grated seasoned carrot. Graham crackers decorated alternately with frosted marked pumpkins in orange and chocolate icing. Ice cream, of course, must be served. When it is chocolate Sundae, a "gob" of orange tinted whipped cream is its crown.

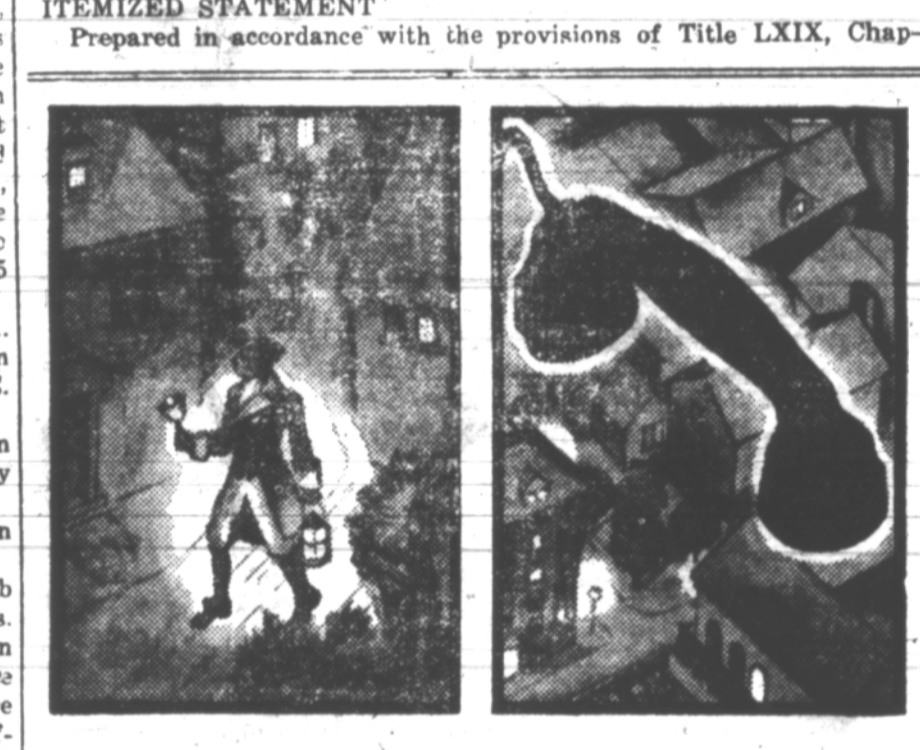
