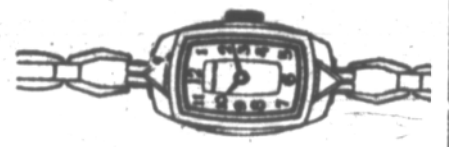
Friday, December 10 the Moro boys came here and played basketball and they were victorious, the score being 30 to 20.
