The county court this week voted to allow \$75 for the publication of the reports of the economic conference which was held here in February and the work of editing the reports will begin at once and the pamphlets containing them will be ready for distribution this spring.

An all time record was broken when no traffic deaths were reported in Oregon during the first two weeks of February. Never since records have been kept has there been so long a span without fatalities upon our streets and highways, according to Earl Snell, secretary of state.

Taxes are payable on or before March 15 and a three per cent discount is allowable for those paid by that time. Many have already taken advantage of this discount and there is still time for others to do so.

January was the twenty seventh consecutive month during which non-resident motorists' registrations in Oregon increased over the corresponding month of the previous year, Secretary of State Earl Snell reports, as 4286 out-of-state drivers checked in this January, 56 per cent ahead of January, 1937.
