Four Draw Penalties
Violation of the laws under jurisdiction of the animal industry division of the state department of agriculture resulted in arrest and conviction of four men last month. One defendant paid a \$10 fine for selling meat unfit for human consumption; another paid a \$5 fine for moving cattle from a southern Oregon county to Portland without first securing brand inspection; and two were given suspended five-year prison sentences for larceny of a calf.
