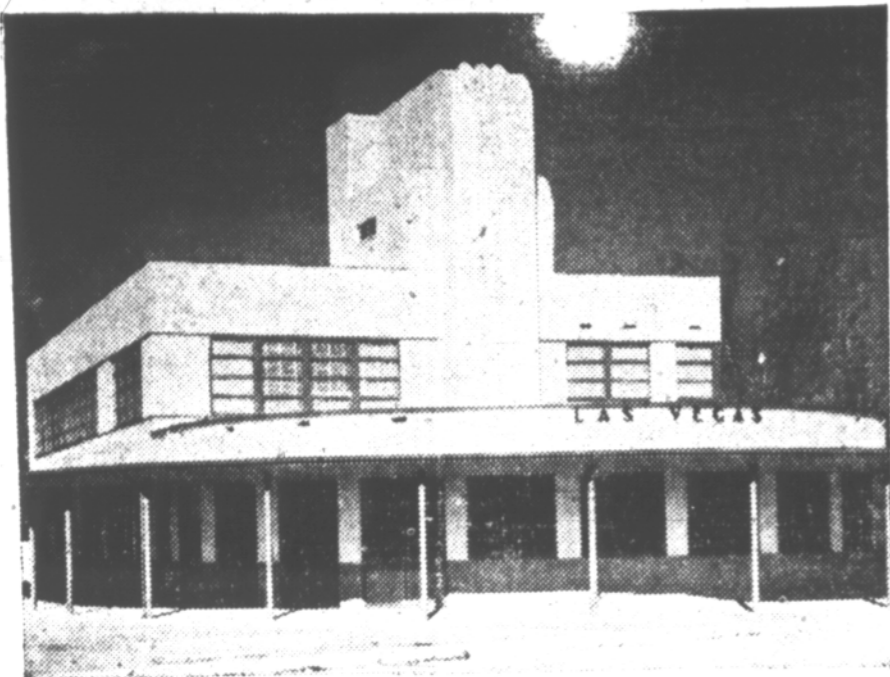


### Modernism Blossoms in Desert

Marshall Dill, new president of the California World's Fair which opens May 25th.

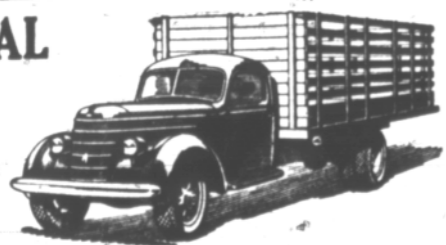
During the 128 days of the California World's Fair he will be on the job to welcome dignitaries who have been invited from all parts of the world.

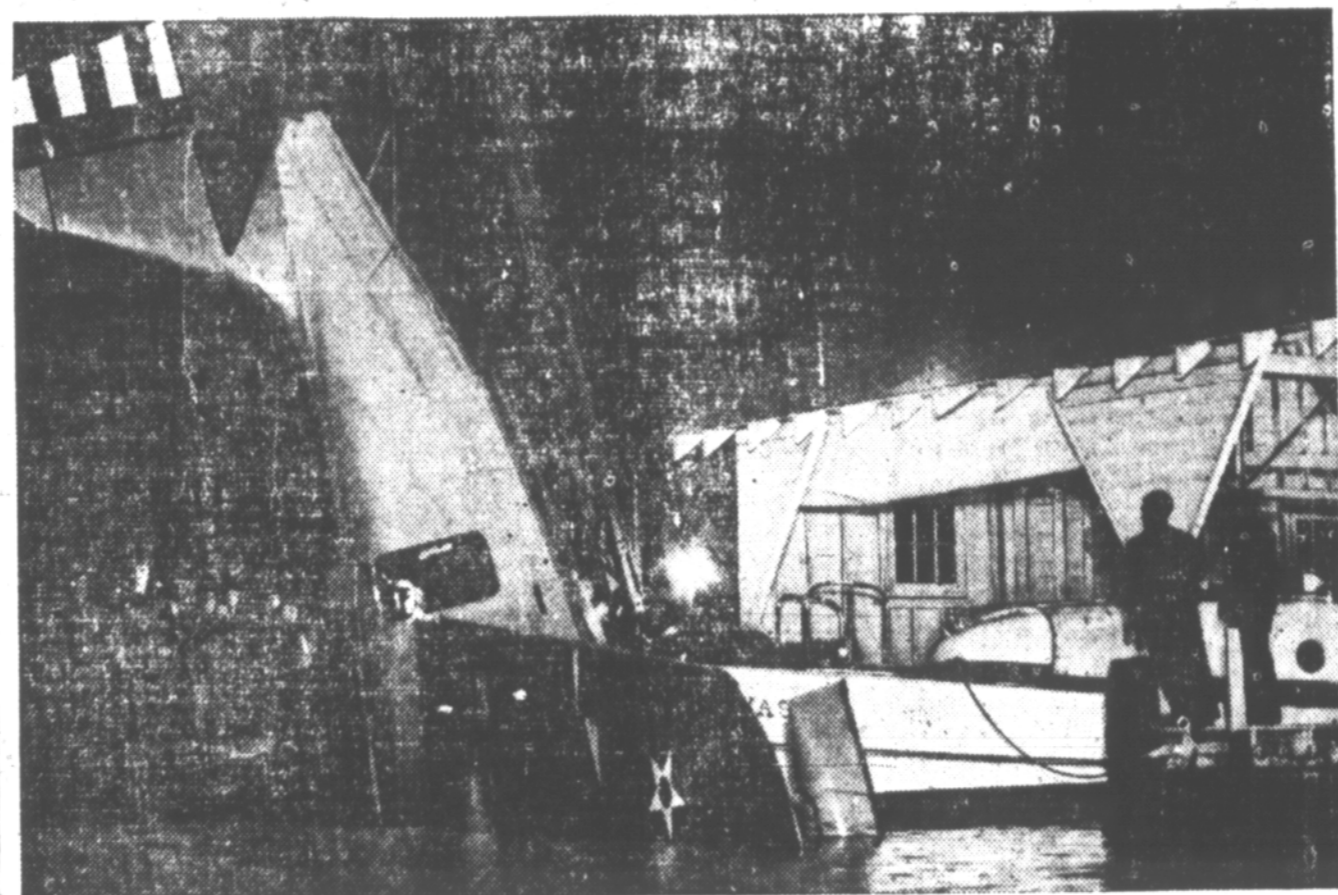
