Modern science confirms this statement by telling us that diet has become an increasingly important factor in the art of beauty culture. These wise men of old could have told you that food kept the vital spark alive in the human body, but again it took modern science to find out just how the trick was turned.

Science discovered, for example, that the bones which make up the sturdy framework are chiefly cal-

cium and phosphorus; that those pearly ornaments, your teeth, more calcium and phosphorus. Science has given us the vitamins, too, five of them vital to the physical fitness everyone desires. Lemon Sponge Custard

- 3-4 cup sugar
- 3 tbsp flour
- 3-4 tsp salt
- 8 egg yolks
- 1 1-2 cups milk
- 3 tbsp lemon juice
- 1 tbsp grated lemon rind
- 3 egg whites

Mix dry ingredients. Beat egg yolk lightly, add with milk. Add lemon juice and rind. Beat egg whites until stiff; fold in. Pour into buttered casserole. Bake in shallow pan of water in moderate oven (350) 45 minutes. Chill. Serves 6-8.

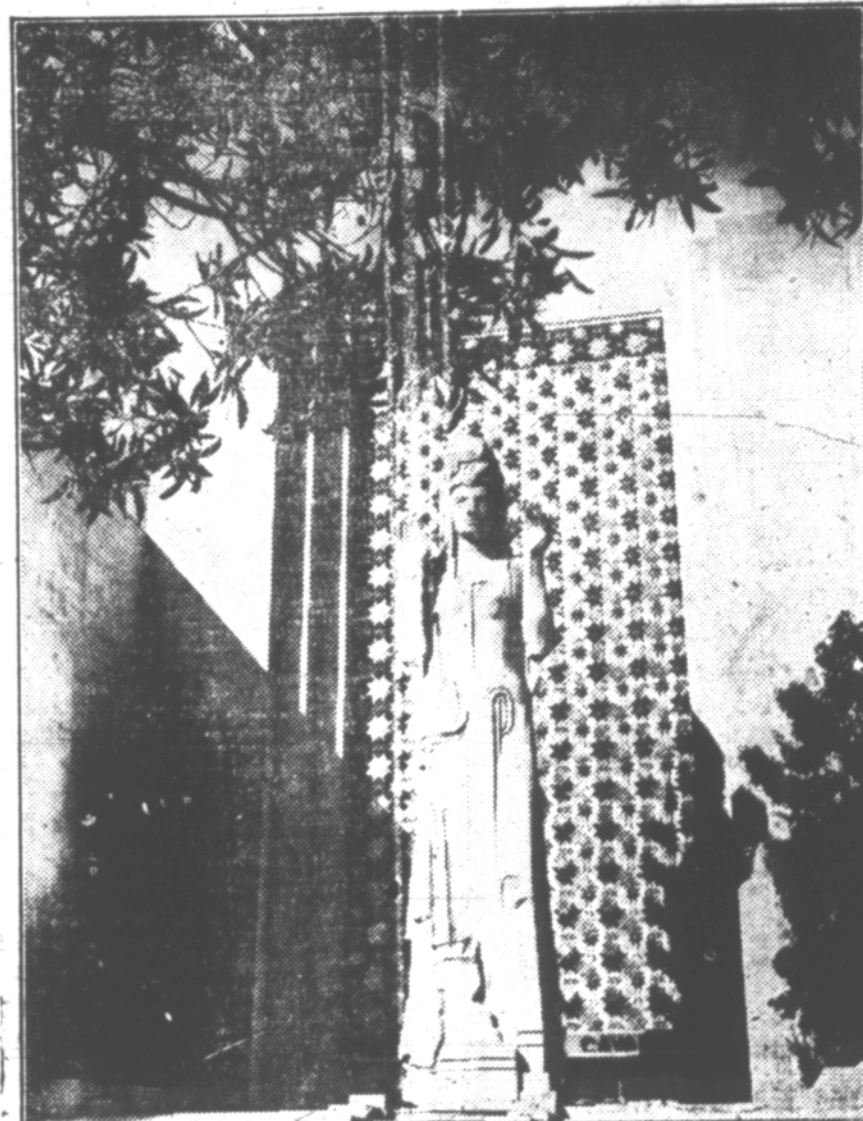

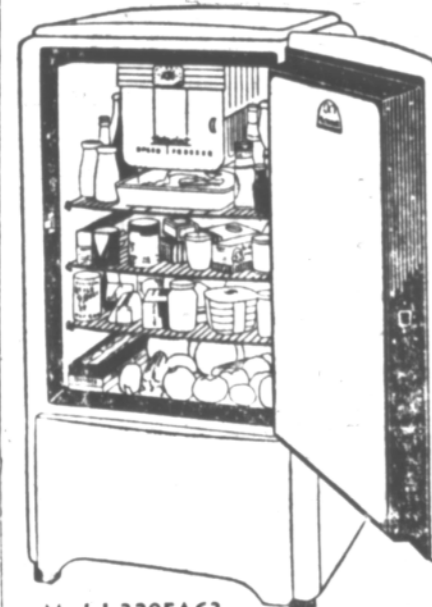
