The senior play, "The Green Light," will be presented Friday evening, May 3rd.

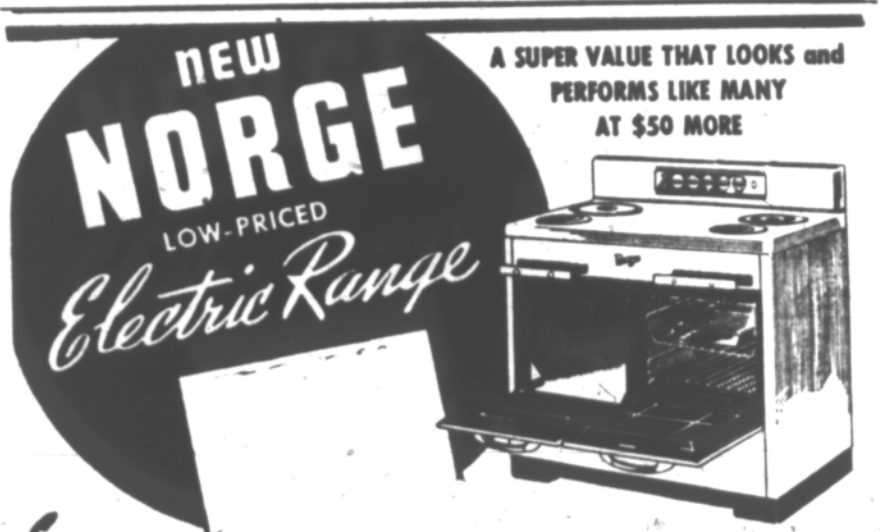
Volna Guyton had the misfortune to receive a bad arm burn last week while working around Gasoline. He has been going to Moro daily for medical care.
