

# Sheriff Reports 77 Percent of Taxes Paid

Collections of taxes so far this year has been satisfactory to Sheriff Charles Wilson who reports that \$108,600 has been taken in over the county since collections started. Over \$100,000 of this has been on current taxes, he says.

The total roll for Sherman county this year is but \$141,212.05 and the total collection of \$108,600 is nearly 77 percent of that sum leaving but 23 percent or less than \$32,000 to be collected on the three other collection dates remaining during the year.

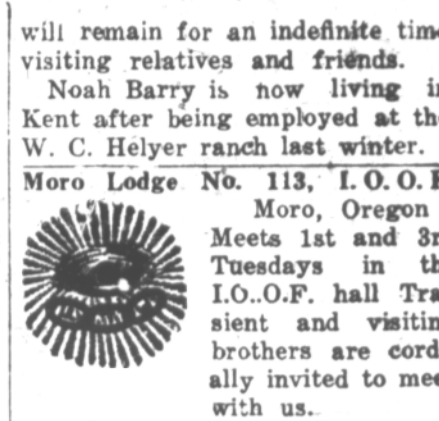
