U of O Will Train Men

The University of Oregon has received a quota of 626 students to be enlisted in the army enlisted reserve corps for the 1942-43 school year. It was announced by Colonel C. L. Sampson Thursday.

Advices from the ninth corps area headquarters at Fort Douglas, Utah, state that enlistments shall be as follows: Freshmen, 210; sophomores, 150; juniors, 140; seniors 126. A total of 68 upperclassmen have already been enlisted under the advanced R.O. C. training, leaving a balance of 558 to be enlisted at the opening of fall term.

Besides the army reserve program, students will also be enlisted in the army air corps and the marine and naval reserves. The number of enlistments under each of these programs is unlimited and it is expected that every qualified student will be signed up at the opening of the school year for officer training in one of the branches of the armed forces.

It is the policy of the government to continue their college education until graduation. Releases will be granted by local selective boards but if any student withdraws from the university he will immediately be called to service under the terms of his enlistment.

During freshman week, preceding registration for fall term, members of the joint army, navy marine and coast guard college procurement committee will be on the campus to advise students on the various branches of service open to them and on the courses which they must take in order to qualify. Students will, however, be allowed to register in any school of their choice at the university. In this way they will be able to complete their education in any field they desire and take the courses required by the armed forces as electives.

HI-WAYS TO HEALTH

There was a time when fruits were classed as luxuries; now they are a daily food on the protective side of our diet because they supply minerals and vitamins in abundance. It's good news to most everyone that among the fruits now on the market are peaches. Yellow fleshed peaches outrank the white fleshed varieties in food value, chiefly because they are such a good source of vitamin A—a vitamin needed by grown-ups and children for good nutrition.

There are many ways of serving peaches. Although most peach fanciers like this fruit served simply-sliced, with cream and sugar. Do not peel the peaches long ahead of time or they'll turn blackish where they are exposed. A grand start for a Sunday breakfast is to slice peaches over your favorite cereal, pour on chilled cream lightly whipped, and over all sprinkle a little brown sugar. And they are delicious served over ice cream or sherbet. Squeeze a little lemon juice over the sweetened, sliced peaches first for added flavor.

Neither cooking nor canning changes the food value of the peach enough to make any difference so if you like your fresh peaches in a pie, a cobbler or as dumplings, have them to your heart's delight. To make a peach dumpling for an individual dessert, roll out pastry dough in rounds about the size of a fruit round. In the center put a peeled peach with pit removed. Sprinkle the peach with a mixture of sugar, cinnamon and a few grains of salt. Dot with butter, lift up and press the edges of the dough together. Put in buttered muffin tins and bake in moderate oven (350 to 375 deg.) about half an hour. Serve hot with plenty of thick cream.

And here is a cream version of peach pie that is delicious.

2 1-2 tsp flour, 3 tsp sugar
Few grains salt, Fresh peaches
1 cup milk, 1 egg, 1-2 tsp vanilla, 1-2 cup cream.

Mix flour, sugar and salt. Add milk; gradually and mix smooth. Cook in double boiler until mixture begins to thicken. Add beaten egg yolk and cook until thick. Cool and add vanilla. Fill a baked pie shell one-half full of sliced peaches. Pour custard mixture over the peaches. Chill. Add cream to the egg white and whip until stiff. Pile lightly on pie.
