Mrs. Ed Feldman, who was ill with flu last week, is now much improved.

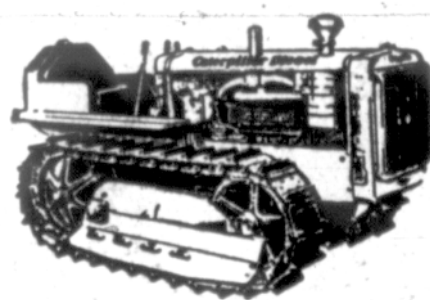
Mr. and Mrs. George Smith and daughter Judy of Grass Valley were week end guests of Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Reid.
