SOCIAL SECURITY FOR FARMERS

Social Security for farm operators, farm workers, business and professional men, household workers, and employees of governmental and non-profit organizations was recommended by the Social Security Board in its eighth annual report. The Board urged inclusion of these groups in an expanded Social Security Program, which would include insurance against cost of medical and hospital care without disturbing the present principle of free choice in selection of physicians or hospitals. The Board recommended that a comprehensive social insurance system should be set up now while earnings are "at record levels" in order to have it in full operation for the post war period.

MORE STUDENTS AT OSC

The vanguard of what is expected to be an increasingly large group of students here registered for the winter term when three disabled veterans of the present world war entered at the expense of the government. These first arrivals are Willoughby Edwards, Langlois, former navy man; Robert T. Sims, Portland, former infantryman, and Norman J. Kennedy, Twin Rocks, from the air corps.

All were disabled too seriously to return to duty are here under the auspices of the Veterans administration. Under the law such men are financed in college courses if the curriculum chosen will lead to definite employment opportunities. The first two chose agriculture and the third forestry.

"A smoke-jumper" gets training on the "let-down rig" at Seeley Lake, Lolo National Forest, near Missoula, Mont. This jumper has on complete uniform except for gloves. The pocket on his right trouser leg contains a length of rope so the "jumper" can let himself down, should he land in a tree. He carries also a two-way radio. U. S. Army medical officers are among those assigned to Seeley Lake for parachute training. Trained "jumpers" are to be kept on yearlong duty for rescue work.

Mr and Mrs Don E. Stinnette shopped in The Dalles Monday.

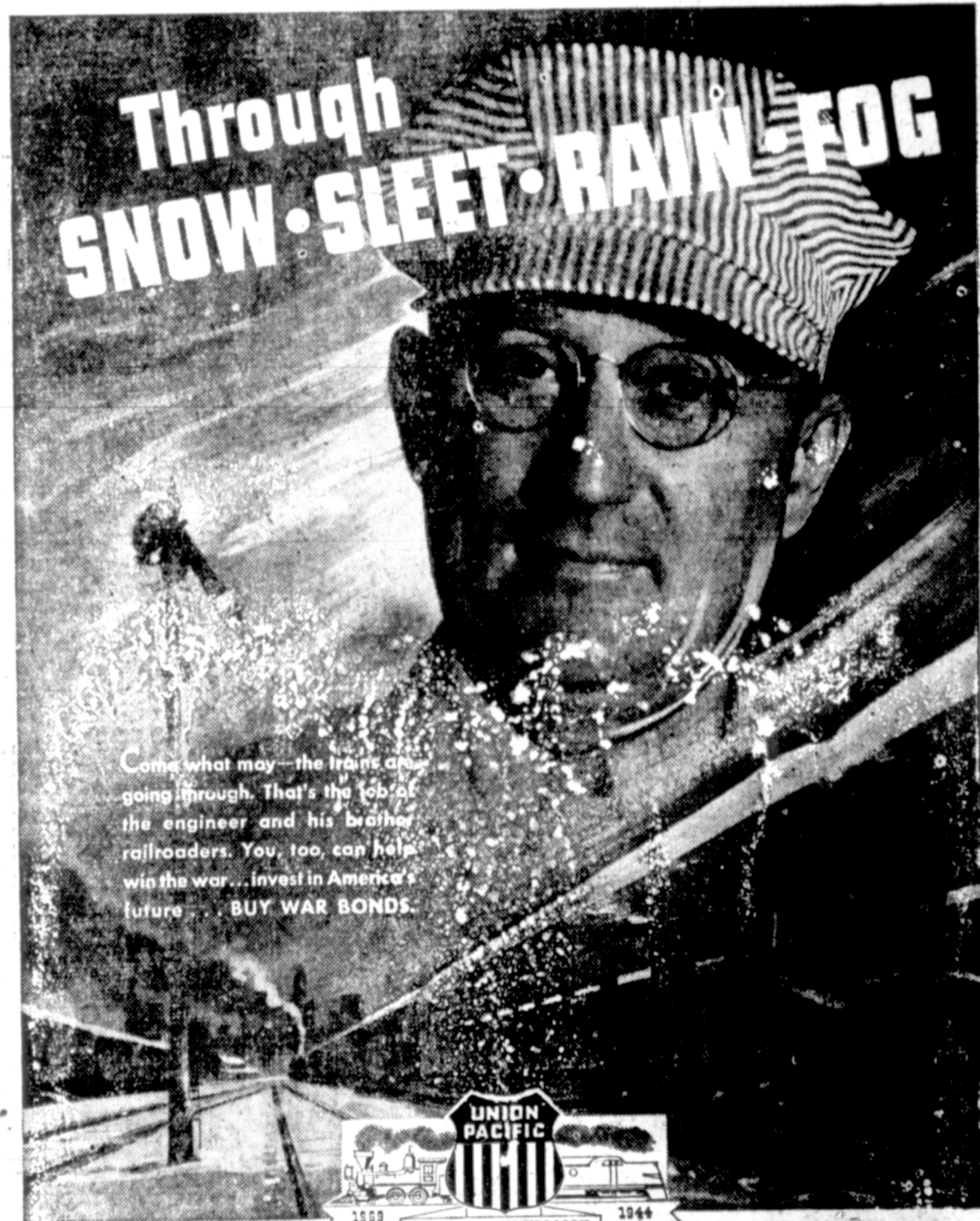
