Pacific Power & Light company has purchased a total of \$47,000 of war bonds in The Dalles district, of which \$6000 will be credited to the Sherman county quota, \$6000 each to the Gilliam and Wheeler county quotas, and the balance to Wasco county.

The funds being put into war bonds by the P.P.&L. company represent cash reserves which will be available for post-war additions and improvements to the system. A total of \$500,000 is being invested by the company in the Fourth War Loan drive.

Other allotments have come from corporations as follows: Shell Oil \$5,000, Union Oil \$5,000, Texas company \$150, State of Oregon \$1525.

Kent has a quota of \$345.20 and Rufus one of \$152.95. Rufus reports sales of \$207.25 to exceed its quota according to report made to Wily Knighten, chairman. These figures total \$2397.90 which exceeds the county school quota of \$2064 by over \$300 with Kent yet to be heard from and another week of sales yet to be made.
