## CIVILIAN SUGAR CUT

Under the 1944 sugar allocation, civilians will get 325,094 fewer tons of sugar, or about 6 percent less, than last year. The increasing needs of the U. S. armed forces and the demand for industrial alcohol made of sugar cane molasses are making additional inroads on the sugar supply. At the same time, shipping space for sugar is being diverted to more important wartime needs. Civilians will still get 75 percent of the total sugar supply for only about 25 percent has been assigned to the armed forces, allies and industrial war needs.
