Harold Case has rented the Methodist parsonage formerly rented by J F Johnson, who will leave Moro and end his partnership with Case in the Moro Garage.

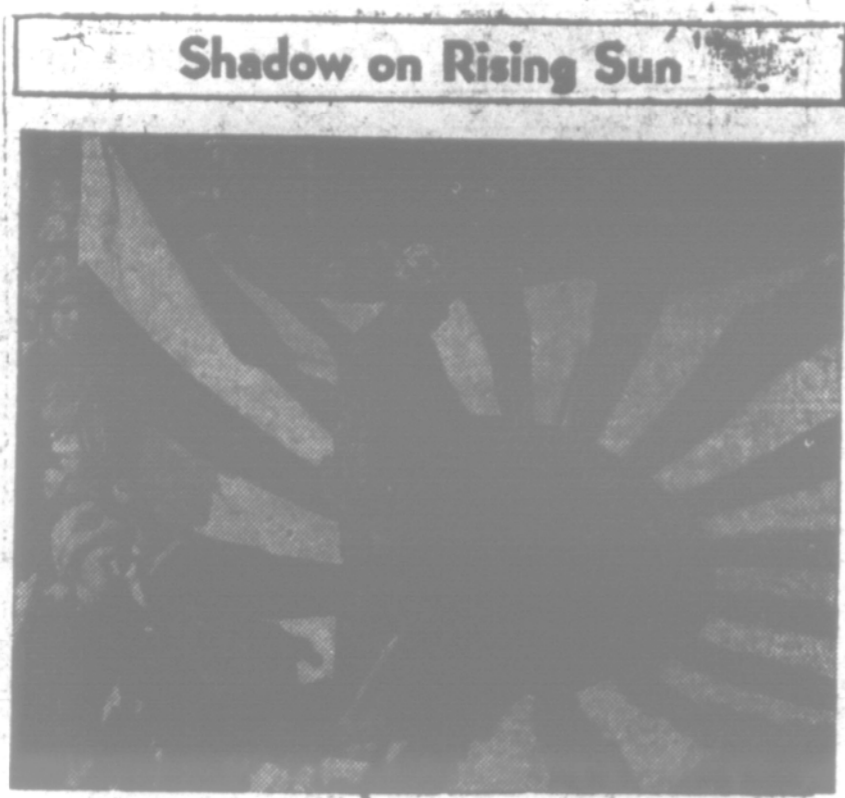

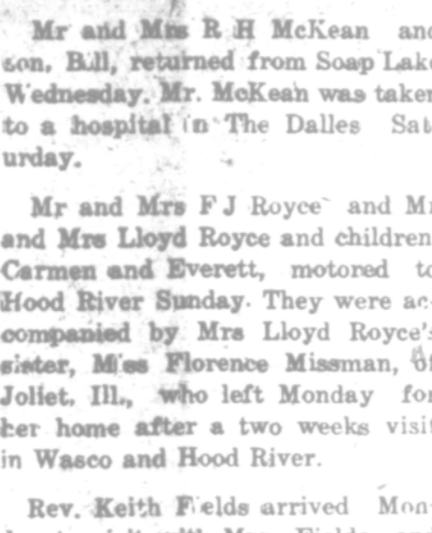
