Miss Cora Fletcher left for her home at Arlington Friday and remained until after Christmas with her parents.

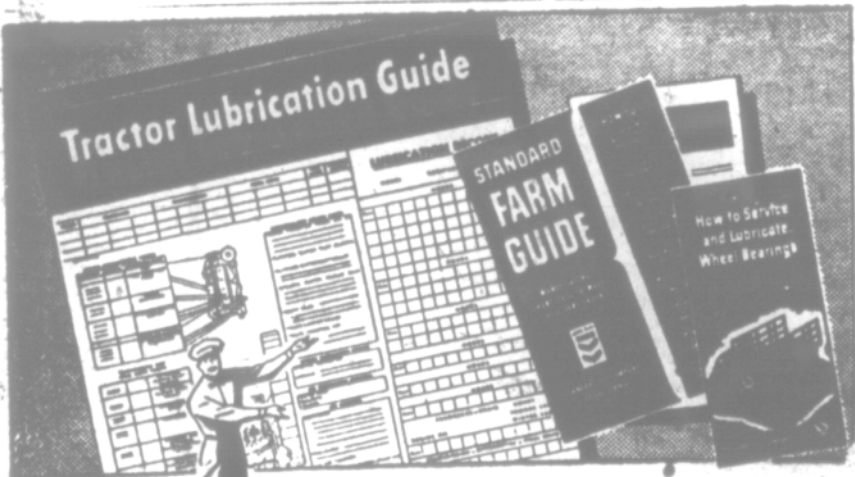
Robert Hoskinson came home last week from Portland to spend the remainder of his recuperation from an operation at home.

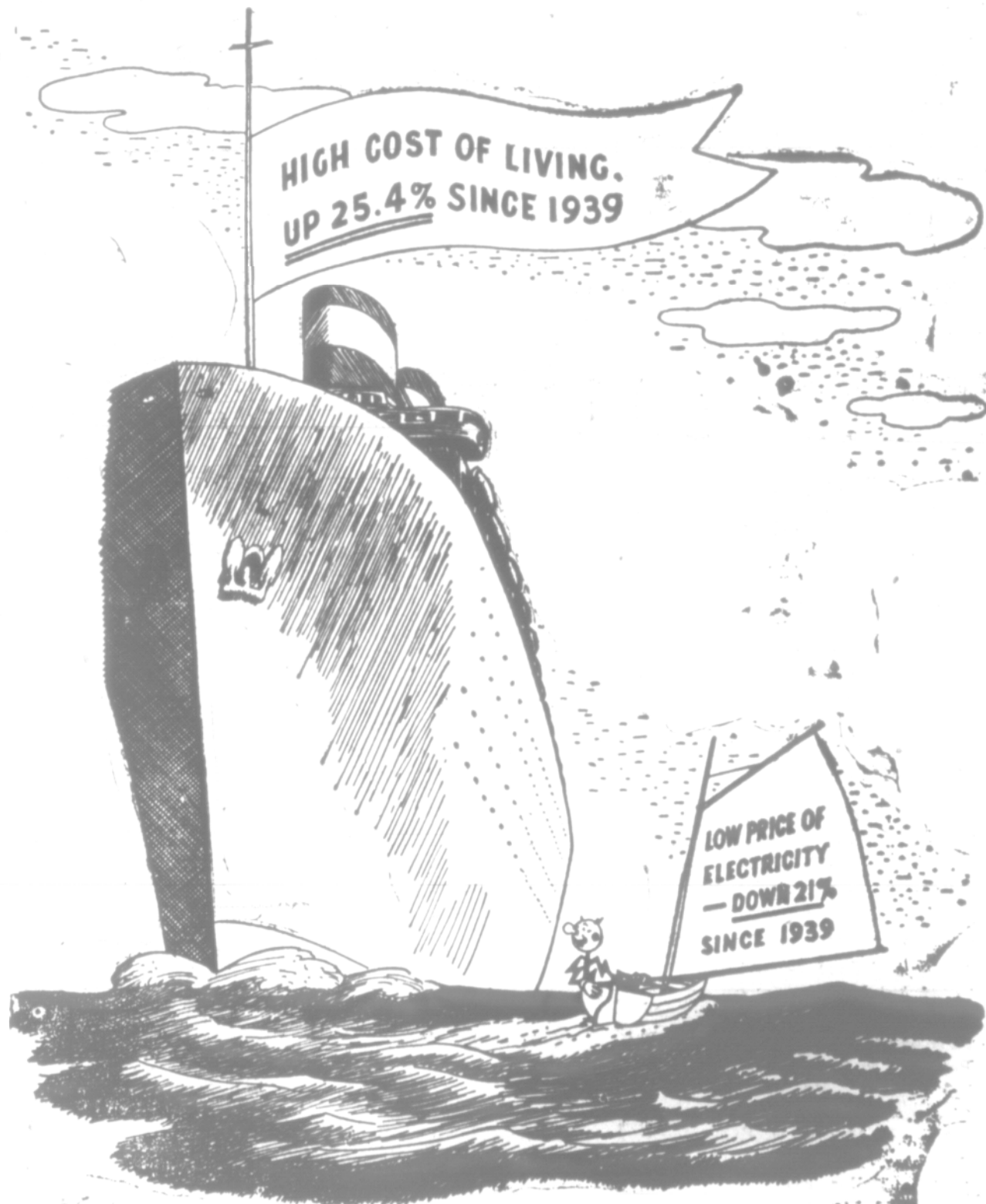
