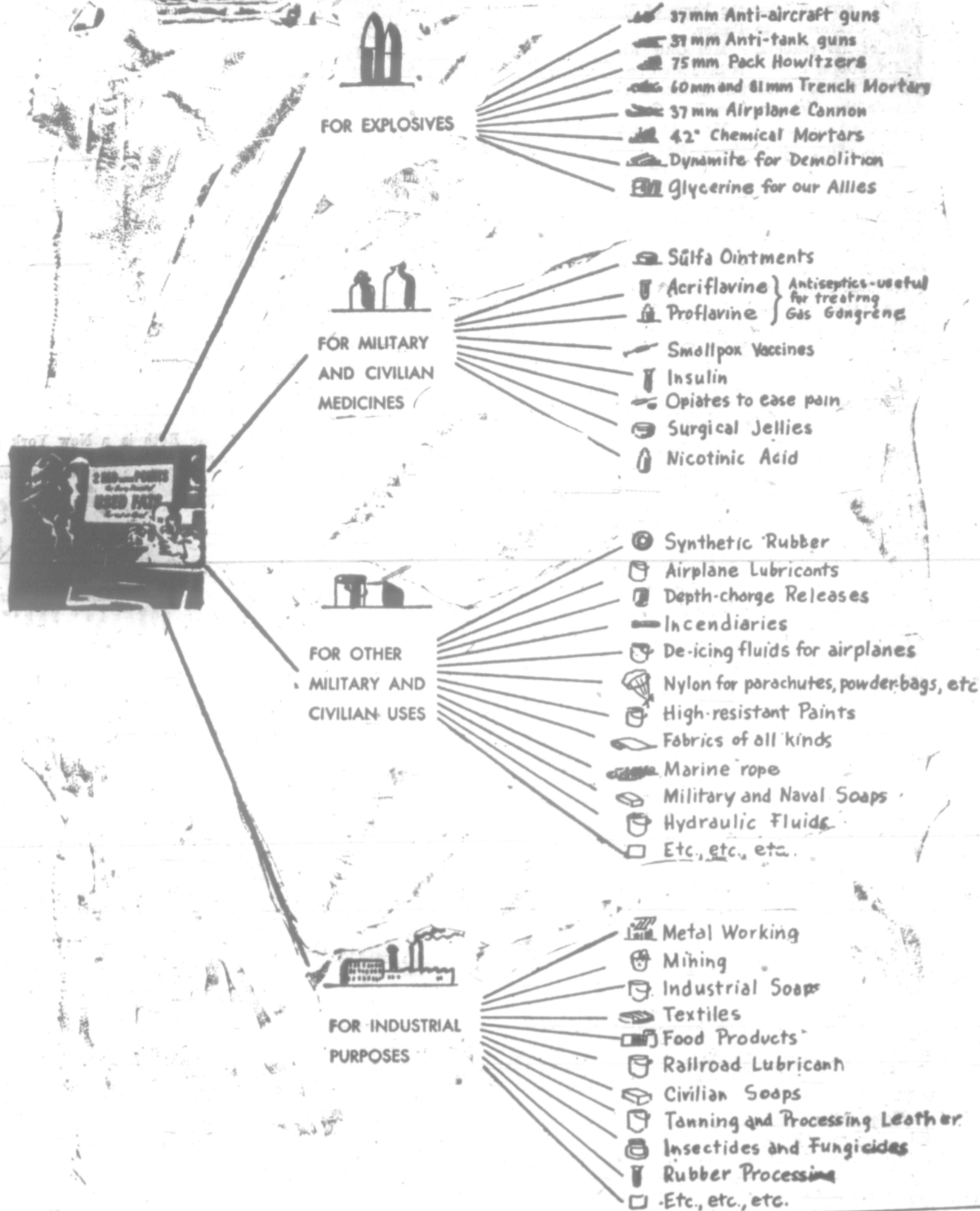

And then comes the firing squad and Kaiser Wilhelm, who started war No. 1 was permitted to find safety in Holland where he spent the rest of his days chopping down trees and writing his memoirs.

Madam Perkins, soon to be ex-secretary of labor, is rumored to have been offered the presidency of a women's college in the east. She, with Harold L. Ickes, secretary of the interior, were the last survivors of the original cabinet of Franklin Delano Roosevelt. One by one the others have disappeared from the scene, but despite many protests Madam Perkins held on to her job, and did so until President Truman decided to shake up the cabinet which he had inherited. Now, "Honest" Harold is the lone representative of the first cabinet.

The new secretary of labor, Judge Lewis Schwellenbach of Washington state, will recapture, as quickly as possible, the many labor activities which were taken away from Miss Perkins. When her resignation was accepted, little remained of the department of labor; the national labor relations board, the war labor board, and all the other labor agencies which rightfully belonged in the department of labor were acting independently of that department. That will soon be changed.
