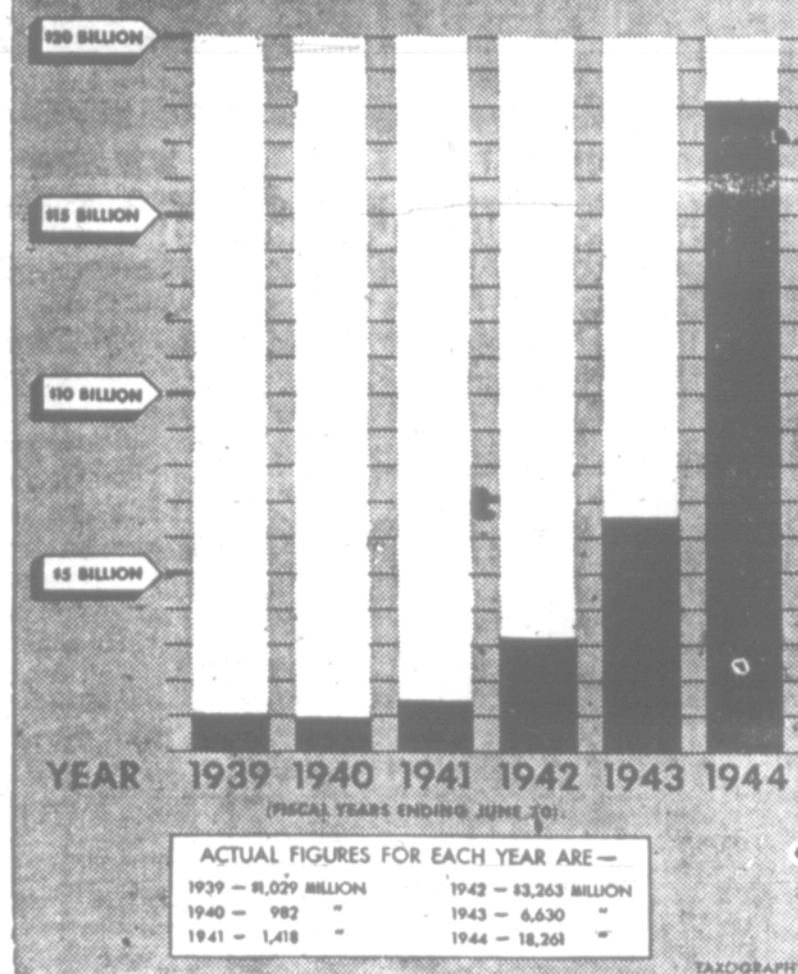

William A. Schoenfeld, dean of the school of agriculture at Oregon State college and director of that institution's experiment stations and extension service, has been reappointed a director of the Farm Credit Administration of Spokane, R. E. Brown, general agent, announced today.

The appointment, made by I. W. Duggan, governor of the Farm Credit Administration, is for a three-year term beginning January 1, 1946. It will be Mr Schoenfeld's fifth consecutive term. As

district director, he automatically serves as a director of the Federal Land Bank of Spokane, Federal Intermediate Credit Bank of Spokane, Production Credit Corporation of Spokane and Spokane Bank for Cooperatives. The dean has served as chairman of the district FCA board during most of the time since his original appointment in 1934.
