**HI-WAYS TO HEALTH**

Although many foods are now unrationed, meat still takes precious red points and the American homemaker will continue to use milk and milk products in the preparation of main dishes to serve instead of meat—foods which not only taste good but also appeal to the eye and satisfy hunger.

One half cupful of cottage cheese supplies as much high quality protein as one serving of meat so don't overlook it. It makes delicious main dishes, desserts, and salads.

Salads are best offensive against jaded appetites because they can be so refreshing and appetizing—so tempting to the eye and palate. Here are two salads that are tops in good eating and will provide a good quantity of the high quality protein which is needed in each day's meals.

Cottage Cheese Stuffed Eggs  
3-4 cup cottage cheese  
2 tsp minced chives 1-4 tsp salt  
1-2 tsp vinegar 4 hard cooked eggs cut in

half, lengthwise  
Mix together the cottage cheese, chives, salt, mayonnaise and vinegar. Add the rice and yolk of three of the eggs. Mix well and pile the cottage cheese mixture in the egg halves. Rice the remaining egg yolk over the top as a garnish. Chill. Serve on crisp lettuce.

Applesauce Cheese Salad  
3-4 cup boiling water  
1 1-2 cups thick applesauce  
1 pkg. lime gelatin Seasonings  
2 cups cottage cheese  
1-2 cup diced celery  
1-4 cup mayonnaise Salad Greens  
Combine water and applesauce and bring to boil while stirring. Pour over gelatin, stir until gelatin is dissolved. Pour into six individual ring molds, which have been rinsed in cold water. Chill until set. Unmold on bed of salad greens. Combine cottage cheese, celery, mayonnaise and salt and pepper to taste. Pile in center of molds. Top with dash of paprika. Serve with additional mayonnaise.

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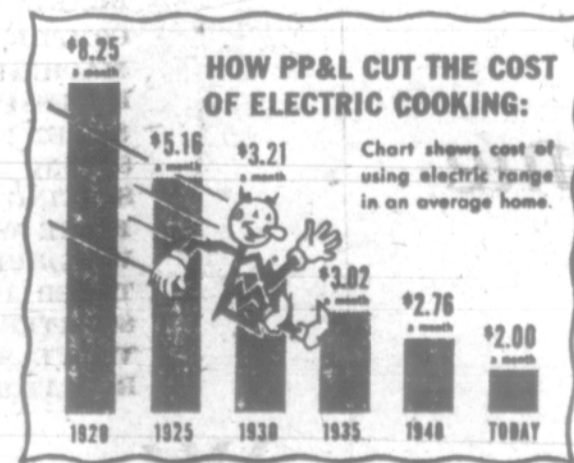
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
